My name is Elizabeth Snyder. I am an avid animal lover and have spent most of my life rescuing them. From birds to squirrels dogs and cats for as far as I can remember. In the last 8 years I have rescued and decided to adopt 3 dogs. Jake my Sheppard chow mix that jumped into my car one day in 2000 and has been by my side since, Max a Rottweiler that was abandoned in a yard as a puppy and Baby a female rotti that was chained to a radiator in an abandoned building under demolition in the Bronx. She was found in January 2003 on one of the coldest days that winter. She was half frozen, under weight, missing fur and scared to death. And when the construction workers walked into that room she wagged her nub and licked them. I decided to keep these 3 because 2 are older dogs and Max is extremely large. This made them difficult to place and the shelters would destroy them after 48 hours.

Now after all these years I found myself divorced and in an extremely difficult financial situation. Baby, the rotti from the Bronx was diagnosed with a mammary tumor and I was handed a Vet bill for \$1063.00. I didn't know what to do. I went to the net and reached out to every shelter I could think of. Every shelter I have spent thousands of dollars donating to over the years. They all turned me down. I was told she's too old. Put her to sleep. We can't help you she is not a shelter dog. And I'm thinking ... of course she isn't a shelter dog. You told me she was not adoptable and she would be destroyed. That is why I adopted her to begin with. I reached out to every Rottweiler rescue group on the net. 2 days later I received an email from Shari Bach. She introduced herself and paws unlimited and was the only one that said "bring her to me and I will help her". Less then a week later we met Shari at the Hudson Valley animal hospital to start treatment. A woman who never met me before and for no other reason other then her love for animals rescued this animal for the second time in her life.
